Application Limits

Our scholarships are split into two categories.

You may apply for up to 2 Category I scholarships.

You may apply for up to 3 Category II scholarships.

In total, you can apply for up to 5 scholarships between the two categories.

Membership

You must be an active AWAM member to apply for a scholarship. If you are not currently a member, please go to our website to join www.awam.org/membership.

Requirements

Some scholarships are only open to female applicants. This will be specified in the **Requirements** section after each scholarship description.

Documentation

Please scan the following documents into a single PDF file in the order they are listed below. You must attach a separate set of application documents for each scholarship you are applying for that requires an extra essay.

- 1. Resume
- 2. Essay(s)

Please include a 250 word essay explaining your interest in aviation. Some scholarships will require an additional essay. This will be specified in the **Requirements** section after each scholarship description.

- 3. Two Letters of Recommendation
- 4. Unofficial Transcript

There are no gender restrictions unless otherwise stated in the requirements. Applicants affiliated with scholarship and award sponsor organizations, are **NOT** restricted from participation. You may apply for up to **two** Category I Scholarships and up to **three** Category II Scholarships

Scholarships for Part 147 A&P School Students

Category I Scholarships:

Airbus Americas Scholarship (I)

Estimated Value: \$5,000 Available Scholarships: 1

One \$5000 scholarship to be awarded to a female student in a trade, technical, college or university education system pursuing a license or degree in an aviation manufacturing related field.

Requirements:

- Applicants must be a student with a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- · Applicants must be in at least their second year of schooling
- Applicants must include a short essay (250 words) on their career aspirations and how they promote and exhibit behaviors that promote a safe, positive, productive and inclusive manufacturing work place

A&P Scholarship from Louisville AWAM Chapter (I)

Estimated Value: \$2,000 Available Scholarships: 2

The Louisville chapter of AWAM is offering two \$1,000 scholarships towards A&P schooling. Funds will be sent to the recipients' aviation college in March 2019.

Requirements:

- Applicants must be a student in Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, Illinois, Michigan, or Tennessee.
- Applicants must be a sophomore, junior, or senior of an A&P program.
- Applicants must be an avid volunteer in their community.
- Applicants must include a short essay (500 words) explaining why they deserve the scholarship.

Requirements:

- Applicants must be students in an FAA approved, FAR Part 147 aviation maintenance
- First scholarship will go to a first-year female student.
- Second scholarship will go to a male or female student, in any year of training.
- Applicants must include a short essay (200 words) on what drew them to a career in Aviation Maintenance.

Pittsburgh Institute of Aeronautics Tuition Scholarship (II)

Estimated Value: 25% of Tuition Available Scholarships: 4

Since 1929, PIA graduates have been extremely sought after as mechanics and technicians in aviation maintenance, electronics, and other related fields. PIA offers placement assistance to help both students and alumni in their pursuit of employment in the field of aviation. PIA is proud to announce their donation of four scholarships, each worth 25% of the quarterly tuition rate. Awards will be given to individuals who are interested in pursuing a degree in aviation maintenance or electronics at PIA's campus in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Current PIA students are NOT eligible. Requirements:

- Applicants must be female.
- Applicants must apply for the scholarship prior to enrolling in the Associate in Specialized Technology Degree
- programs at the Pittsburgh Institute of Aeronautics on main campus.
- Applicants must meet minimum enrollment requirements for PIA (www.pia.edu).
- Applicants must include a 200+ word essay answering, "Why they chose a career in Aviation?"



Pratt & Whitney Training Scholarships (II)

Estimated Value: \$3,000 - \$6,400 each Available Scholarships: 6

The Pratt & Whitney Engine Maintenance Scholarship is designed to support those in the aviation industry. They offer a variety of instructor-led engine maintenance courses on large commercial engines or the smaller Pratt & Whitney Canada PT6 engine series. Only 5% of all A&P mechanics have the opportunity to attend a Pratt & Whitney engine training course! Their advisors will help students select a class that best suits their personal development and professional growth. Courses are taught at the Customer Training Center in Hartford, CT and at Flight Safety locations throughout the United States and Canada. Hotel accommodations and airfare (domestic coach only) are included as part of the scholarship. Scholarships must be used within two years from date awarded.

NOTE: Children or spouses of executives of Pratt & Whitney are not eligible to apply

Requirements:

Applicants must be at least **one** of the following:

- Certificated A&P mechanic. (A copy of the A&P Certificate must be included with the application packet.)
- Student in an FAA approved, FAR Part 147, aviation maintenance training program.
- Faculty of an aviation maintenance school.
- Owner of Pratt & Whitney engine.
- Member of an organization that supports, maintains, and overhauls P&W engines.
- Engineer.
- Applicants must include a short essay (200 words) that explains their interest in aviation maintenance in particular.
